The 30th Annual Vail Invitational Figure Skating Championship Announcement

Rules/Conduct/Eligibility: The competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of US Figure Skating, as set forth in the 2010 US Figure Skating Rulebook including Governing Council additions and revisions, unless otherwise stated in this announcement.

This competition is open to all eligible members of the U. S. Figure Skating. Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline. Skaters may skate up one level higher than tested. Skaters that have never tested previously may also move up one level and compete at the pre-preliminary level. Pre-preliminary, Preliminary, and Pre-Juvenile will be grouped according to age. Juvenile and up will be grouped randomly. All competitors must comply with U.S. Figure Skating requirements relating to test and eligibility.

- If necessary the Competition Committee reserves the right to combine event levels, as well as boys, girls, ladies and men's groups. The Committee also reserves the right to limit the number of entries accepted or to cancel an event due to time constraints.
- Skaters entered in the Vail Invitational Free Skate or Compulsory Move events may not enter a Mtn. Fun event.
- An axel is a single jump.
- If entries warrant, Final Rounds will be offered for Juvenile through Senior Free Skate. The Short Program is a separate event with no final round. In events with final rounds, if there are two groups, the top six from each group will advance to the final round. If there are three groups, the top five from each group will advance to final round.
- We will attempt to divide adults by levels whenever possible.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

All events will utilize the 6.0 judging system in accordance with 2010 US Figure Skating Rules 2010-2049, & 2072.

ENTRIES:

Entries must be postmarked by May 24, 2010. If space is available late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the registrar and chief referee. A \$50 late entry fee will be assessed.

PLEASE CHECK YOUR ENTRY CAREFULLY WITH YOUR COACH BEFORE ENTERING. Changes requested after the entry deadline may be made at the discretion of the competition committee, but are not guaranteed. A \$15 FEE WILL BE CHARGED FOR EVERY CHANGE MADE AFTER THE ENTRY DEADLINE. Changes made after July 1st may not appear in the Official Program. **Notification of competition times and practice ice schedules will be e-mailed to competitors and coaches. Please make sure the correct e-mail address is on the entry form.**

LIABILITY: Skaters, parents, and coaches should read US Figure Skating Rule 3222 regarding club, facility, and US Figure Skating liability. Your signature on the entry form will indicate that you have read and accept this section.

E-Mail communication is preferred but, if necessary, you may direct questions to Stephanie Harrison at (970) 376-4102 or Shawn Boris at (970) 926.9225. Calls will be accepted between 9 am and 8 pm, Mountain Time.

REGISTRATION: The official registration desk will be maintained at Dobson Arena. The desk will open at 4:00 pm on Wednesday, July 14 and remain open until 8:00 pm. On the following days, the Registration Desk will be open one hour prior to the start of competition and will remain open during all competition events. Skaters must submit their official music CDs at the time of registration.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained at Dobson Arena during the competition and all official times of events will be posted. Skaters and coaches are required to check the official bulletin board for any changes. Posting of such notices, changes or announcements shall be considered sufficient notice to all participants. Competitors should arrive at the arena one hour prior to their scheduled event time. Events may start up to 30 minutes earlier than the posted start times.

PHOTOGRAPHY/VIDEO: Award photos, event videotapes and digital action photographs will be available for purchase. Flash photography of any kind is not permitted.

AWARDS: All events will receive medals for first through fourth places. Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary events will receive medals for all placements. An engraver will be available to personalize awards. Local Motion Productions has a "NO personal cameras" policy, therefore personal photos will not be permitted during the award presentations

FACILITIES: Dobson Arena is an indoor 85 x 200 foot ice surface with rounded corners and seating for spectators. A concession stand is open during the competition. Locker rooms are available.

MUSIC: Competitors must furnish their own music. **Only CD's (standard CD-R format only) will be accepted, cassettes will not be accepted.** They must be clearly marked with the competitor's name, event, and running time of music. The program music must be the only piece of music on the CD. The official competition CD must be turned in at the Registration Desk at the time of registration, and at least one hour prior to your event. No skater will be allowed to register without submitting his or her music CD. Entrants should be sure that the CD is of good quality and a duplicate CD should be readily available. CD's should have no more than a 3 second lead-in. Music may be picked up at the registration desk immediately following the event. The best possible care will be taken; however, The Skating Club of Vail cannot assume liability for damage. If music is left after the event it will be held for 2 weeks and then discarded. PRACTICE ICE: Practice Ice must be pre-ordered on the enclosed registration form. Practice ice will start on Wednesday, July 14, 2010. Practice ice fees are \$15.00 per session. Music will not be played during practice ice. Only two sessions may be purchased with your registration. Please do not send money for extra sessions. There will be no refunds on practice sessions nor will changes to the practice ice session be allowed. Additional ice, if available, will be sold on a first-come, first-serve basis during registration. We will do everything we can to provide adequate ice, but be aware that we have one ice surface and practice ice is limited to the day before the competition, the evening of Thursday, July 15th, as well as early morning and evening hours (as early as 6:00 am, as late as 10:00 pm) on competition dates. Practice ice for final rounds will be made available to competitors who qualify. Additional practice ice can be purchased whenever the registration desk is open or from the practice ice monitors.

No practice ice or event times will be given out by telephone. You will be notified by e-mail of your competition and practice ice time. Assigned practice times will be sent to you with notification of event times. You must include payment for total requested practice ice time with your registration form.

COACHES: Coaches will be required to register at the registration desk and show their USFS registration card to verify proof of insurance and the USFS required background screening

VAIL INVITATIONAL COMPETITION EVENTS

COMPULSORY MOVES

Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. Compulsory moves will be skated without music. Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between elements. Additional or repeated elements will be penalized. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between jumps. An axel is a single jump. Required individual jumps cannot be repeated as part of the combination jump. In Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile events where there are insufficient entries at a particular level, groups may be combined and male and female entrants judged together. Required elements may be skated in any order but must not exceed the maximum time restriction.

SHORT PROGRAM

Short Program will be offered at the Juvenile, Open-Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels. Required Elements, Program Times, Age and Test Requirements are those for the 2010-2011 season as found in the current rulebook, or as amended at May Governing Council. Juvenile and Open-Juvenile requirements will be the same as those for Intermediate. The Short Program is a separate event with no final round. See Rules 3600-3711 for rules and requirements..

WELL-BALANCED FREE SKATE

Skaters may enter either the Well-Balanced Free Skate or the Test Track Free Skate but not both. Skaters may skate to vocal or non-vocal music of their choice. Age and test requirements as listed in the US Figure Skating Rulebook, Rules 3600 - 3720 for rules and requirements unless noted below. Adult skaters should refer to Rules 3730 – 3805. If entries warrant a final round will be held for Juvenile levels and higher.

TEST TRACK FREE SKATE

Skaters may enter the Well-Balanced Free Skate or the Test Track Free Skate but not both. Skaters may skate to vocal or non-vocal music of their choice.

Deductions WILL be made from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description, from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element and for any spin with less than required revolutions.

SPINS ONLY

Age and test requirements are the same as those listed under Free Skate. No music allowed in this event. Spins must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Connecting steps may be used but will not affect the score. **Levels with the same requirements will be combined if entries warrant.**

JUMPS ONLY:

Age and test requirements are the same as those listed under Free Skate. Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile and Adults will be skated on 1/2 ice. All other levels will skate on full ice. Jumps must be skated in the order in which they are listed, exactly as listed, however the order of jumps within the combination jump is optional (example double/single or single/double). This is not a mini-program. Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jumps are allowed. Extra moves and excessive connecting steps will be penalized. An axel is a single jump. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. The event will be conducted as follows: At the conclusion of the warm-up, the skater will perform the first jump twice, then the second jump twice, then the combination jump twice. The judges will score only the best performance of each jump. This will then be repeated for all skaters. In levels where skaters have a choice of jumps, skaters may not change jumps on the second attempt. **Levels with the same requirements will be combined if entries warrant.**

ARTISTIC

New this year...singles events will be offered in two categories – Dramatic (a serious, emotional artistic interpretation) and Light (any performance not considered serious enough to be dramatic). Skaters may enter one or both of these categories.

Costumes are encouraged but not mandatory, but they should not pose a safety hazard to the skater. Music may be vocal. Props will be allowed to be placed on the ice, and or picked up by the skater at any point in the program. Props that sit on the ice need to be constructed strongly enough that there is not a safety issue. No debris can be left on the ice. A skater cannot use live props, fire, water, smoke or explosives. A skater can only take 10 seconds to put the prop on the ice and the prop needs to be something the skater can bring on and off the ice without assistance. Props are not allowed during warm-up. Judging will be based on artistic expression, originality, creativity and musical interpretation that characterize the correct mood of the program. Program should focus on entertainment value rather than technical skill.

Ladies and men will compete together. Depending on the number of entrants levels and dramatic/light may be combined.

Maximum Skating Times: (Applies to Solo, Duets and Ensembles)

Solo: Events will be offered for the Pre-Preliminary through Senior and Adult Levels. Qualifications are the same as for Free Skate.
Pre-Preliminary - 1:40 seconds Junior & Senior – 2:40 seconds
Preliminary & Pre-Juvenile – 1:40 seconds Adults – 1:40 seconds
Juvenile, Intermediate & Novice – 2:10 seconds

Duets: No test requirements. Skaters may be of the same gender. When possible, skaters will be grouped by age and/or test level. Maximum skating time same as Solo event.
