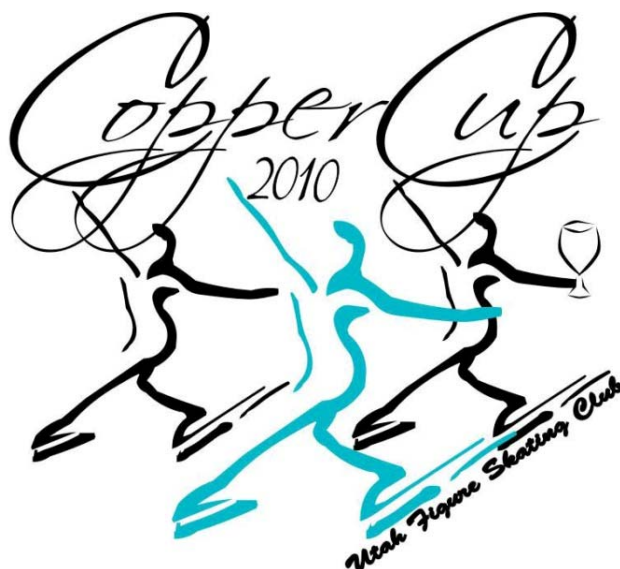
FIGURE SKATING COMPETITION

The 6.0 system will be used to judge all Basic Skills, Artistic, Showcase, Adult, No-Test through Pre-Juvenile levels in the Well-Balanced Free Skate Program Track, Limited Beginner through Senior in the Competitive Test Track.

COPPER CUP 2010 JULY 8-10, 2010

LOCATION: South Davis Recreation Center, 550 North 200 West, Bountiful, Utah. This is approximately 10 miles north of Salt Lake City. The ice surface is enclosed and is 200' X 100' with slightly rounded corners. A snack bar will be open during competition.

COMPETITION EVENTS: Well-Balanced Freeskate Program Track, Competitive Test Track, Basic Skills Freeskate, Special Needs/Developmental/Unified Pairs, Artistic and Showcase (Artistic Light).

SANCTION: Copper Cup 2010 is sanctioned by U.S. Figure Skating. The competition will be conducted according to the rules of U.S. Figure Skating as shown in the 2010/2011 Rulebook ("Rulebook"), except as otherwise stated in this Announcement. New rules adopted at Governing Council in May 2010 will be followed in accordance with their effective dates,

QUALIFICATIONS: Test qualifications will be effective as of the closing of entries on May 31, 2010. The skater may skate one level above his or her current level. All previous first-place winners in the most recent Copper Cup competition must skate one level higher regardless of test level status, except for juvenile, intermediate, novice, junior, senior, and adult events. The skater's US Figure Skating membership must be up to date by July 1, 2010 or the skater will not be eligible to compete.

ENTRY FEES: Short & Long Free Skate programs will be judged as combined events. All other events will be judged as individual events. The Free Skate is considered to be the first event.

ENTRIES: The Entry Form and Practice Ice Form and the Planned Program Sheet, together with appropriate fees, must be postmarked no later than Tuesday, May 31, 2010.

EVENT SCHEDULE: A tentative schedule of events and practice ice times will be posted online at www.utahfigureskating.com as soon as they are available. All skaters should confirm their event times at the registration desk. Skaters should check in at the Registration Desk at least 45 minutes prior to their scheduled event time.

PLANNED PROGRAM SHEETS: Planned Program Sheets must be completed and included with the Registration forms no later than May 31, 2010. Any entry forms not accompanied with a Planned Program Sheet will be considered incomplete. A blank Planned Program Sheet can be found at www.usfigureskating.org

LATE ENTRIES: Late entries may be accepted only with the approval of the Referee and an Event Co-Chair, and must also be accompanied with a \$75.00 late fee payment.

RETURNED CHECKS: An additional \$25.00 will be charged on any returned check. All further payments must be made in cash or with a money order. Skaters will not be allowed to practice or to compete until all payments are current.

REFUNDS: No refunds will be given for any reason whatsoever after the registration closing date of May 31, 2010. If only one skater registers for an event, the skater will be given the opportunity for an exhibition/judges' critique.

COACH REGISTRATION: All coaches must comply with the Coaches Registration Policy in order to be allowed to instruct and coach at this event. Coaches will need to check in at the Registration Desk and show a U.S. Figure Skating Coach Registration Card. If a coach has not registered by July 1, 2010, and does not have written evidence of that registration or a Registration Card, that coach will not be allowed to instruct or coach at this event. Coaches who are under 18 years of age and who only have Basic Skills students are exempted from this requirement.

PRACTICE ICE: Reservations for all practice ice must be made and paid for in advance. The practice ice request form must be completed and mailed to the Registrar along with the completed Entry Form, postmarked no later than May 31, 2010.

The official day for practice ice will be July 8, 2010. Skaters may register for only one practice ice session per event entered. Short and long programs will be considered as two separate events. Practice ice times will be posted at www.utahfigureskatingclub.com when available. Practice ice schedules will not be given by telephone. Practice ice fees are non-refundable.

MUSIC: All competitors must provide their own music on CD's (No CD-RW's), one event only per CD. The CD must be plainly marked with name, event. Please bring two copies of each CD. Music should be turned in at the registration table one hour before the event to be skated and picked up following the event. Utah FSC will not be responsible for any music not picked up by the skater.

OFFICIAL NOTICES: An official bulletin board will be maintained in the lobby area of the arena and shall be considered to be sufficient notice to competitors. Skaters should check with the registration desk in the arena one hour before the event is scheduled to begin. Check bulletin board for changes. The referee may begin the competition events up to 30 minutes early.

SCHEDULED EVENTS: Under US Figure skating rules, two entries are required to hold an event. Single entries will be scheduled to skate their events and receive an award. Groups may be divided or combined at the discretion of the referee. Skating order will be posted at the first official practice ice. The names of other competitors and the actual group in which each is skating will not be posted until the first official practice. This information will not be available by telephone.

ADMISSION: There is no admission charge to any of the events.

JUDGING: The closed system of judging will be used for all events. The IJS system will be used to judge all Well-Balanced Freeskate Program track events in the Juvenile/Open Juvenile through Senior levels. The 6.0 system will be used for all Basic Skills, Artistic, Showcase, Adult and No-Test through Pre-Juvenile levels in the Well-Balanced Freeskate Program track and in the Limited Beginner through Senior levels in the Competitive Test track. There will be no final rounds. All events will be judged using the US Figure Skating 2010/2011 Rulebook, here after this will be referred to as Rulebook. Special Needs/Developmental/Unified Pairs will be judged according to the 2003-2006 Special Olympics Winter Sports Rules for Figure Skating.

REFEREE: The decision of the referee on all matters will be final. The referee, along with the competition co-chairs, shall have the right to exclude any person whose behavior is unruly or not sportsmanlike. All technical events below the Juvenile level and all Artistic events will be split into groups at the complete discretion of the Referee taking into account the number of entries and the ages of the skaters.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented immediately following the posting of the results for each event. Medals will be given for first through fourth places in each event. All Basic Skills competitors who do not place will be given participation awards. Only the Special Needs skater will receive an award for the Unified Pairs Category. No award will be given to the partner.

COPPER CUP JUVENILE MOST INSPIRATIONAL AWARD: This award is presented to the skater who, in the opinion of the judges, demonstrated competitive spirit, sportsmanship, and exuberance for the Juvenile Free Skate Event.

IDA TATEOKA INTERMEDIATE BEST PERFORMANCE AWARD: This award is presented to the skater who, in the opinion of the judges, gave the best performance for the Intermediate Free Skate Event.

PHOTOGRAPHS: Group award photos of the top four skaters in each event will be taken and will be available for purchase. Also, group photos will be taken of all Basic Skills events and will be available for purchase. Individual skater photographs may also be purchased if desired. No personal flash photography will be allowed during events in the ice arena, and violators may be removed from the competition venue because of the danger to skaters.

ITEMS ON ICE: To ensure skater safety, no item may be thrown on the ice following any event or individual skater.

VIDEOS: Videos will be available for purchase during the competition. In accordance with U.S. Figure Skating guidelines, no unauthorized taping of skaters other than your own is allowed.

ACCOMMODATIONS: The following hotels are about 4 miles from the South Davis Recreation Center. Restaurants are nearby. There are many other fine hotels in the Salt Lake City area. Driving time from Salt Lake City to Bountiful is approximately 20 minutes, except between 4:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. At that time driving time may be 45 minutes. BASIC SKILLS FREE SKATE DIVISION

ALL EVENTS ARE OPEN TO SKATERS OF ALL AGES. The competition is open to all skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills Program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills Program/Club or any other Basic Skills Program/Club. Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All Snowplow Sam and Basic Skills Skaters through Basic 8 must skate at highest level passed and no official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. The same restrictions apply to all skaters, including but not limited to skaters taking private lessons. Where entries permit, groups will be divided by gender and age. Adults are welcome and are strongly encouraged to participate. All events are Well-Balanced Free Skate program events. Basic Skills division Snowplow Sam – Basic 8 level Free Skate programs may be skated to instrumental or vocal music and will be 1:00 minute in duration (+/- 10 seconds). All levels will be performed on full ice.

The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. Elements from a previous level are permitted; however, elements from a higher level are prohibited and a .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from the higher level. Each program must contain the following required elements to be skated in any order (taken from the U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills handbook).

- SNOWPLOW SAM:** March Followed by a Two-Foot Glide and Dip
Forward Two-Foot Swizzles 2 - 3 in a Row
Forward Snowplow Stop
Backward Wiggles 2 - 6 in a Row
- BASIC 1 FREE SKATE:** Forward Two-Foot Glide
Forward Snowplow Stop
Forward Two-Foot Swizzles 6 – 8 in a Row
Backward Wiggles 6 – 8 in a Row
- BASIC 2 FREE SKATE:** Forward One-Foot Glide (either foot)
Two-Foot turn in place – Forward to Backward
Backward Two-Foot Swizzles 6 – 8 in a Row
Forward Alternating ½ swizzle pumps, in a straight line – across width of ice (slalom like pattern)
Moving Snowplow Stop
- BASIC 3 FREE SKATE:** Forward Stroking
Forward ½ swizzle Pumps on a circle, either clockwise or counter clockwise 6- 8 consecutive
Moving Forward to Backward Two-Foot turn (either direction)
Backward One-Foot Glide (either foot)
Two-Foot Spin
- BASIC 4 FREE SKATE:** Forward Outside edge on a circle, either clockwise or counter clockwise
Forward Crossovers 6 – 8 consecutive, Both Directions
Forward Outside 3-turn – R & L from a standstill
Backward Stroking
Backward One-Foot Snowplow Stop (either foot)
- BASIC 5 FREE SKATE:** Backward Outside edge on a circle, either clockwise or counter clockwise
Backward Crossovers 6 – 8 consecutive, Both Directions
One-Foot Spin (minimum 3 revolutions)
Side toe Hop, either direction
Hockey Stop

- BASIC 6 FREE SKATE:** Forward Inside 3-turn – R & L from a standstill
Bunny Hop
Forward Spiral on a straight line, either R or L
Forward Lunge, either R or L
T-Stop (either foot)
- BASIC 7 FREE SKATE:** Forward Inside open Mohawk, R to L & L to R
Ballet Jump (either direction)
Backward Crossovers to a Back Outside edge landing position – Clockwise & Counter Clockwise
Forward Inside Pivot
- BASIC 8 FREE SKATE:** Moving Forward Outside or Forward Inside 3-turns, R & L
Waltz jump (entry optional)
Mazurka (either direction)
Combination Move: Two Forward Crossovers into FI Mohawk, step behind, step into one
Backward Crossover and step to a FI edge (clockwise or counter clockwise)
Beginning One-Foot upright Spin (optional free foot position)
- FREE SKATE EVENTS: Free Skate 1 – 6** - For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.
- The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise stated. To be skated on full ice. The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use, but is not required to use, any additional elements from a previous level. A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level. Vocal music is not allowed. Music duration: 1:30 minutes (+/- 10 seconds).
- FREE SKATE 1:** Advanced Forward Stroking (4-6 consecutive strokes)
Scratch Spin from Backward crossovers
Waltz jump from Backward crossovers
Half-Flip jump
- FREE SKATE 2:** Forward Outside Spiral, either R or L
Toe loop jump
Beginning Back Spin
Waltz jump-side hop- Waltz jump series
- FREE SKATE 3:** Forward crossovers in a figure 8
Back Spin
Salchow
Waltz jump/Toe loop or Salchow/Toe loop combination
- FREE SKATE 4:** Forward Power 3s (2-3 consecutive sets), either R or L
Sit Spin
Loop jump
Waltz jump/Loop jump combination
- FREE SKATE 5:** Camel Spin
Forward upright pin to Back upright spin
Loop/Loop combination
Flip jump
- FREE SKATE 6:** Camel/Sit Spin combination (min. 4 revolutions)
Split or Stag jump
Lutz jump
Waltz jump/half loop/Salchow combination

COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK

Skaters may enter either the Test Track Free Skate program or the Well-Balanced Free Skate program track, but not both, during the same non-qualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. 6.0 Judging will be used. All events are Well-Balanced Free Skate program events. Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description. Skaters must be 20 years of age or younger as of the competition date. Vocal music is allowed at all levels.

Deductions will be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from each mark for each technical element that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.
- 0.1 for each 10 second time violation.
- 0.1 for step sequences not fully utilizing the ice surface, Pre-Juvenile and higher levels.

LIMITED BEGINNER: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters may not have passed tests higher than U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Free Skate badge tests.

ELEMENTS:

2 Solo spins in an upright position (min. 3 revolutions)

Jumps with not more than one-half rotation (front to back or back to front)

Jump sequences are allowed

Maximum 5 jump elements

Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program

BEGINNER: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters may not have passed tests higher than U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills Free Skate badge tests.

ELEMENTS:

2 Solo spins in an upright position, change of foot optional (min. 3 revolutions)

Jumps with not more than one-half rotation (front to back or back to front)

Single rotation jumps – Salchow and toe loop only

Jumps combinations and jump sequences are allowed

Maximum 5 jump elements

Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program

PRE-PRELIMINARY: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters may not have passed tests higher than U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Two solo held in one position only of a different nature (Min. 3 revolutions, no flying spins)

Jumps with not more than one rotation (No axels)

Jump combinations or sequences using only a Waltz jump, Toe loop and Salchow

Maximum 5 jump elements

Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program

PRELIMINARY TEST: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test, but may not have passed tests higher than the Preliminary Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Two spins of a different nature, combination spins allowed (min. 3 revolutions each & no flying spins)

Jumps with not more than one rotation (No axels). Jump combinations and sequences are allowed

Maximum 5 jumping elements

Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program

PRE-JUVENILE: Program Duration: 2 Minutes (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate test, but may not have passed tests higher than Pre-Juvenile Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Three spins in any position (min. 4 revolutions), one must be a combination spin with change of foot optional (min. 3 revolutions on each foot or 6 total revolutions). No flying spins.

Jumps with not more than one rotation (No axels). Jump combinations and sequences are allowed

Maximum 6 jumping elements

One step sequence, straight line, circular or serpentine, fully utilizing ice surface

JUVENILE TEST: Program Duration: 2 Minutes 15 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skate test, but may not have passed tests higher than Juvenile Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Three spins in any position (min. 4 revolutions), one must be a combination spin with one change of foot (min. 4 revolutions on each foot). May include flying spins

Any single jumps and jump combinations with not more than 1½ rotation (Axel permitted)

Maximum 6 jumping elements

One step sequence, straight line, circular or serpentine, fully utilizing ice surface

INTERMEDIATE TEST: Program Duration: 2 minutes 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate test, but may not have passed tests higher than Intermediate Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Three spins in any position (min. 4 revolutions), one must be a combination spin with at least one change of foot (min 4 revolutions on each foot). May include flying spin

Any single jumps

Double jumps may only be the double Salchow and the double Toe loop. Jump combinations and sequences allowed.

Maximum 6 jumping elements

One step sequence, straight line, circular or serpentine, fully utilizing ice surface

NOVICE TEST: Program Duration: 3 Minutes for ladies and 3 Minutes 30 Seconds for men (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate test, but may not have passed tests higher than Novice Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Three spins in any position (min 6 revolutions), one must be a combination spin with at least one change of foot (min. 5 revolutions on each foot). May include flying spins

Any single jumps

Double jumps may only be the double Salchow, double Toe loop and the double Loop. Jump combinations and sequences allowed

Maximum 7 jumping elements

One step or spiral sequence (see Rule 3640 for description)

JUNIOR TEST: Program Duration: 3 Minutes 30 Seconds for ladies and 4 Minutes for men (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Novice Free Skate test, but may not have passed higher than Junior Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS:

Three spins – one must be a flying spin, a solo spin (6 revolutions each) and combination spin consisting of all three positions and one change of foot (min. 2 in each position and min. 5 revolutions on each foot)

Any single jumps and double jumps may only be the double Salchow, double Toe loop double Loop and the double Flip. Jump combinations and sequences allowed

Maximum 7 jumping elements for ladies and 8 for men

Ladies: One step sequence and one spiral sequence (see Rule 3640 for description)

Men: Two different step sequences

SENIOR TEST: Program Duration: 4 Minutes for ladies and 4 Minutes 30 Seconds for men (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Junior Free Skate test.

ELEMENTS: Four spins (min. 6 revolutions on all solo spins) – one must be a flying spin, one a solo spin, one spin combination consisting of all three positions and one change of foot (min. 2 in each position and min. 5 revolutions on each foot)

At least four different double jumps – one must be a double Lutz. Jump combinations and sequences allowed

Maximum 7 jumping elements for ladies and 8 for men

Ladies: One step sequence and one spiral sequence (see Rule 3640 for description)

Men: Two different step sequences

WELL-BALANCED FREE SKATE PROGRAM TRACK

Vocal music is permitted at the Intermediate and lower levels.

NO-TEST FREE SKATE: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Open to skaters who have not passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3720 in the Rulebook. No axels or double jumps permitted. Maximum of 5 jumping elements. Maximum of 2 spins of a different nature. One step sequence utilizing ½ the ice surface.

PRE-PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Open to skaters who have not passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3710 in the Rulebook. Axels are permitted. No double jumps are permitted. Maximum of 5 jumping elements. Maximum of 2 spins of a different nature. One step sequence utilizing ½ the ice surface.

PRELIMINARY FREE SKATE: Program Duration: 1 Minute 30 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skate test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skate test. Program in accordance with 3700 in the Rulebook. One jump must be an axel/waltz jump jump-type jump. Maximum 5 jumping elements. Maximum of 2 spins of a different nature. One step sequence utilizing ½ the ice surface.

PRE-JUVENILE FREE SKATE: Program Duration: 2 Minutes (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3690 in the Rulebook. Program may include an axel, and up to four different double jumps. Double jumps may be repeated in jump sequence or jump combination.

JUVENILE FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 12 years of age or under at close of entries.

OPEN JUVENILE FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 13 years of age or older at the close of entries.

FOR EITHER EVENT: Program Duration: 2 Minutes 15 Seconds (+/- 10 Seconds)

Skaters must have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3680 in the Rulebook.

SHORT PROGRAMS: Use requirement 3640-3671 in the Rulebook.

INTERMEDIATE FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes. Free Skate program duration: 2 minutes 30 seconds (+/- 10 Seconds). Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Novice Free Skate Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3672 in the Rulebook.

NOVICE FREE SKATE:

Short program maximum duration: 2 minutes 30 seconds. Free Skate program duration: 3 minutes for ladies and 3 minutes 30 seconds for men (+/- 10 Seconds). Open to skaters who have passed the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test, but not the U.S. Figure Skating Junior Free Skate Test. Free Skate program in accordance with 3663 in the Rulebook.

JUNIOR FREE SKATE:

ADULT SILVER FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 21 years and older as of close of entries who have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Adult Bronze Free Skating Test, but no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile or the Adult Gold Free Skating Test. Program in accordance with 3790 in the Rulebook . Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 10 seconds.

YOUNG ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE: Open to skaters ages 16 - 20 as of close of entries who have passed no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3780 in the Rulebook . Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 40 seconds.

ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE: Open to skaters 21 years and older as of close of entries who have passed at least the U.S. Figure Skating Adult Silver Free Skating Test, but no higher than the U.S. Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with 3780 in the Rulebook . Free Skate program maximum duration: 2 minutes 40 seconds.

Any jumps, spins, and footwork sequences incorporated into the program should be to enhance the above components. Costumes should be in accordance with U.S. Figure Skating rules. Props, including hand-held, are not allowed. At the discretion of the referee, groups may be combined and/or divided.

Special Olympics Skater Showcase – 1:30 minutes maximum

SHOWCASE (ARTISTIC LIGHT)

Skate time durations adhere to National Showcase requirements.

These events are designed to portray a character or theme through the use of music and costume.

One mark will be awarded based on the following criteria:

- 1) Entertainment value. This principal element is comprised of showmanship, artistic, and theatrical qualities, and audience appeal.
- 2) Music and choreography. The performance must fit the music. The routine should use the full ice surface with the skating elements reflecting musical interpretation. Creativity and originality will be credited.
- 3) Skating. Skating elements should carry out the mood of the music/choreography and will be judged on how they enhance the performance and interpretation of the music. Difficulty of moves/elements will not be a factor. Choreography and skating ability should be consistent with the skating level entered.
- 4) Costumes and props. Costumes and props should reflect the music and must be appropriate for the performance and age of the skater. A prop must be incorporated into the performance and not just scenery. Props must be carried on and off the ice by the skater in a reasonable amount of time.

If insufficient entries are received, levels may be combined at the discretion of the referee. Males and females will compete against each other.

Except for the addition of this event and the requirements that follow in this Addendum, all other components of the original Announcement remain unchanged.

ENTRY METHOD: Each team shall submit with its application a separate typed listing of its members in alphabetical order along with corresponding USFSA numbers. Please use the attached Entry Forms 1, 2, and 3 "Copper Cup Official Entry Form for Synchronized Skating."

JUDGING: The closed system of judging will be used for the Basic Skills Synchronized Skating event using the 6.0 system.

<p style="text-align: center;">BASIC SKILLS/BEGINNER EVENTS SYNCHRONIZED SKATING DIVISION</p>
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GENERAL INFORMATION: No skaters may have passed higher than the preliminary test in any discipline, and the majority of the team must be "no test." The purpose of this competition event is to promote a fun, introductory competitive experience for the beginning skater.

A. Basic Skills Beginner 1

A team of 8 to 16 skaters. The majority of the team must be under the age of 9 as of May 31, 2010.

Program duration: 1 ½ - 2 minutes +/- 10 seconds.

Required elements:

- a. **Circle.** 1 circle, include a 2-foot turn and a forward inside and/or forward outside edge glide.
- b. **Line.** Cover the ice and include only forward skating skills.
- c. **Block.** Cover the ice and include only one configuration.
- d. **Wheel.** A 4-spoke wheel with backward pumps.
- e. **Intersection.** 2 lines facing each other, forward 2-foot glide at the point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- No additional elements allowed.
- Holds may only include shoulder-to-shoulder and hand-to-hand.
- No changes or direction and traveling within elements.
- No steps or moves in Basic 6 or higher.

B. Basic Skills Beginner 2

A team of 8 to 16 skaters. The majority of the team must be 9 – 11 years old as of May 31, 2010.

Program Duration: 1 ½ - 2 minutes +/- 10 seconds.

Required elements:

- a. **Circle.** 1 circle, include the combination move* from Basic 8.
- b. **Line.** Cover the ice may include both forward and backward skating skills.
- c. **Block.** Cover the ice and include 1 or 2 configurations.
- d. **Wheel.** Wheel of choice with backward pumps.
- e. **Intersection.** 2 lines facing each other, forward

2-foot or 1-foot glides at the point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- No additional elements allowed.
- Holds may only include shoulder-to-shoulder and hand-to-hand.
- No changes or direction and traveling within elements.
- No steps or moves in Free Skate 2 or higher.

C. Basic Skills Beginner 3

A team of 8 to 16 skaters. The majority of the team must be at least 12 years old as of May 31, 2010.

Program Duration: 2 – 2 ½ minutes +/- 10 seconds.

Required elements:

- a. **Circle.** 1 circle, include the combination move* from Basic 8.
- b. **Line.** Cover the ice must include both forward and backward skating skills.
- c. **Block.** Cover the ice and include 2 or 3 configurations.
- d. **Wheel.** Wheel of choice.
- e. **Intersection.** 2 lines facing each other, forward 1-foot glide or forward lunge at the point of intersection.

Restrictions:

- No changes or direction and traveling within elements.

* The combination move is element C in Basic 8: Two forward crossovers into a forward inside mohawk, step down or cross behind, step into a backward crossover, step forward onto a forward inside edge glide. It does not need to be repeated, and does not need to be done in both directions.

These levels are part of the U.S. Figure Skating Basic Skills program. Basic Skills competition guidelines will be used. There will be no more than 6 teams in each group, and judges must only be members of U.S. Figure Skating at least 16 years old. Beginner 1 and Beginner 2 can be combined, at the discretion of the chief referee.
