Rules and Conduct of the Competition

The Cup of Colorado will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of the United States Figure Skating, as set forth in the 2010-2011 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rule book, which includes the changes and revisions approved by the Governing Council, unless otherwise stated in this announcement.

The competition is open to all eligible skaters who are members in good standing of the U.S. Figure Skating, and foreign nationals who are members in good standing with their own National Associations, in accordance with Part Two, rule 3056. Skaters may compete at one level above their test level. All events must be skated at the same level with the exception of Juvenile: Juveniles should compete at all events at the same level with the exception of Short Program where they may skate up to Intermediate SP. You may not skate down in any event. Event eligibility is based on age and test status as of July 24, 2010.

Entries/Deadline

Secure online Registration and credit card payment will be available at www.coloradoskatingclub.net until **12:00 midnight, Sunday, July 25, 2010**. Paper Competition entries must be postmarked by **Saturday, July 24, 2010**. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Referee and the Competition Committee and only if accompanied by a \$30.00 late fee. Please contact us before submitting a late application. The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit entries in any event or to cancel an event due to time restrictions. Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date unless no competition exists in an event entered. Two entries will constitute an event.

Judging System

The ISU Judging system will be used for all Juvenile and above Free Skate and Short Program events. The ISU Judging System will be used for all Juvenile through Senior Pair Short Program and Free Skating Events. The ISU Judging System will be used for all Juvenile through Senior Singles & Pairs Short Program. In all other events, including dance, the 6.0 system will be used. For Juvenile and above, planned element sheets need to be submitted online by Saturday, July 25, 2010. This form is found in the member's only section: <https://www.usfsaonline.org>. Facilities

The South Suburban Ice Arena has two indoor ice surfaces 85' x 200'. A snack bar and spectator seating is available. No admission will be charged.

Registration

The registration desk will be open in the lobby of the South Suburban Ice Arena one hour prior to the beginning of the events on Friday and Saturday, and from 7:30 am to close of events on Sunday.

Awards

Awards will be made as soon as possible after the conclusion of each event. Medals will be given to the top four (4) in all events. All competitors in Pre-Preliminary and Preliminary will receive a medal or a ribbon. We will attempt to secure Local Motion Productions for group and individual photos.

Video

We will attempt to secure Local Motion Productions for event recording. Local Motion Productions produces DVD recordings for purchase.

Music

All Competitors must provide their own music on compact disk. CDs should only have one track recorded. Music is to be turned in at least 1 hour before your event at the registration desk/ check-in. A backup copy of the music should be readily available at the actual time of competition. The music committee will take reasonable precautions to safeguard your CDs but will not be responsible for music forgotten after practice ice, after the event, or damaged during play. Cassette tapes will not be accepted.

Official Notices

An Official Bulletin Board will be maintained at South Suburban Ice Arena. Each competitor and coach is expected to check this board for the official times of events and/or changes in schedules. Competitors are asked to check in with the Ice Monitor forty-five (45) minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. Events may run up to 15 minutes early. Notices posted on the Official Bulletin Board will be considered sufficient notice to all entrants. The CSC website will contain entry information, practice and competition schedules, and any changes. Please check it often www.coloradoskatingclub.net .

Practice Ice

If you wish to purchase practice ice, please complete the enclosed practice ice request at the end of this entry form or online when you register. The fee for each 20 minute session is \$12.00. There will be no refunds on practice ice sessions. Following the close of entry and the posting of your competition schedule you will be able to select your practice ice sessions online at www.coloradoskatingclub.net. No music will be played on practice ice. Additional Practice Ice may be available for purchase at the competition, please check with the Registration Desk for availability. Practice Ice Forms and Fees are due along with the Entry Form and must be received by July 24, 2010.

Note: You will receive an email with a PIN number which you will use to access your practice ice records and select your sessions. Practice Ice will be \$12.00 if you pre-order the sessions.

Entry Fees

Please use the official entry form to enter this competition. The entry fee for all competitors up to and including Pre-Juvenile is \$68.00. The entry fee for all Juvenile and above level skaters is \$78.00. Each event entered is \$30.00 including pair events (\$15.00 per partner). The fee for synchronized teams is \$100.00.

Entry information and schedules will be posted on the CSC website as soon as it is available. Please use our website www.coloradoskatingclub.net to check your entry information for accuracy.

The CSC website will be your source for verification of entry and review of schedules, nothing will be mailed. If you do not have internet access, please ask your coach or a friend to check our site for you.

A service charge of \$30.00 will be added to any returned checks. Payment by money order or cash will be required in these cases.

School Friendly Event

The Colorado Skating Club intends for this to be a school friendly event. We will make every attempt not to schedule school age competitors (age 18 and below) before 4:00 pm on Friday and out of town school age competitors before 7:00 am on Saturday. (In 2008 there were no Friday events.)

Competition Events:

Two entries in a division will constitute a competition. For Single skaters, the level a skater enters for Free Skate will determine the same level for all events. An exception is made for Juveniles only. Juveniles should compete all events at the same level with the exception of Short Program where they may skate up to Intermediate SP. Test and age requirements are based upon the entry deadline (July 24, 2010). If necessary, Ladies' and Mens' groups at the same level may be combined for spins, jumps, interpretive, artistic and solo dance events, skaters will be notified of combined groups.

Free Skate Events:

Event level is based on age and free skating test level as listed below. Requirements as stated in U.S. Figure Skating Rules: Part Two, rules 3600-3721.

Adult:

Open to all skaters 21 or older as of July 25, 2010. Adult Open to skaters 19 to 20 yrs of age as of July 25, 2010. Requirements will follow well balanced program guidelines as proposed/passed by 2010 Governing Council.

Short Program:

Short Program events will be offered at the Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels. Required elements and times will be as set forth in the 2010-2011 US Figure Skating Rule book for the 2010-2011 Competitive Season. Juveniles may skate an Intermediate Short, otherwise entrants qualify according to their Free Skate level entered.

Spins:

Entrants will qualify according to their Free Skate level entered. Spins should be skated in a short routine (one minute, 15 seconds max with no music) including connecting steps. Excessive additional elements will be penalized. The numbers in the () indicate the minimum number of revolutions required for the spin. Competition committee may combine levels if necessary to form complete groups. (No more than 2 levels per group).

Interpretive:

Interpretive is offered to Pre-Preliminary thru Senior as well as Combined Adult event. Competitors must enter Interpretive Events at the same level as their Free Skate event entered. Competitors not entered in a Free Skate event must enter at the level determined by their Free Skate test passed. **Costumes:** The Interpretive event does not allow theatrical costumes or garish make-up. Skaters may not use any props. **Skating Procedure:** Skater must report to the monitors 20 minutes prior to start of competition so they may listen to music prior to event. Skaters will be taken to the music room 15 minutes prior to stated event to listen to the music. Prior to each Interpretive event, all competitors for that event shall assemble in a separate room from the ice arena to listen to the music. The music will be played twice in the room, and twice during warm-up. After the warm-up, all the competitors will be returned to the room, except the first skater, who will then perform. Each skater will remain in the room until it is their turn to perform. **Judging:** Credit for jumps and spins will be based solely on their choreographic effectiveness. If there are fewer than 3 entries in any division, two levels may be combined in order to create competition. Competition committee may combine levels if necessary to form complete groups. (No more than 2 levels per group)

Artistic:

Levels will include Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Open Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, and Adult. Competitors must enter Artistic events according to their Free Skate level entered. Competitors not entered in a Free Skate event must enter at the level determined by their test passed. Program times as follows:

Pre-Preliminary	One minute, 30 seconds maximum
Preliminary and Pre-Juvenile	One minute, 40 seconds maximum
Juvenile and Intermediate	Two minutes, 10 seconds maximum
Novice and Junior Combined	One Minute, 40 seconds maximum
Adult	One minute, 40 seconds maximum

Costumes are not mandatory but encouraged. Music will be of the skaters' choice and may be vocal. Judging will emphasize artistic expression. Regarding props - A hand held prop should be one that the skater can hold and skate with. The prop will be allowed to be placed on the ice, and or picked up by the skater at any point in the program. Props that sit on the ice need to be constructed strongly enough that there is not a safety issue. No debris can be left on the ice. A skater cannot use live props, fire, water, smoke, or explosives. A skater can only take 10 seconds to put the prop on the ice and the prop needs to be something a skater can push on and off the ice without assistance. No props are allowed to be touching the ice during warm up.

Synchronized Teams:

Team division will be in accordance with Rules found in the 2010-2011 Official US Figure Skating Rule Book for the 2010-2011 Competitive Season. If competitions do not develop by divisions, the Competition Committee reserves the right to determine groups based on age, test level, and previous competition experience with each entering Synchronized Teams' agreement. Duration of the program will not change. All synchronized teams must be registered with the U.S. Figure Skating. Team contact person will be notified.

Compulsory Moves:

Age and test requirements are the same as listed under Free Skate. Entrants qualify according to their Free Skate event entered. Compulsory Moves will be skated without music. Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between the elements. Additional or repeated elements and excessive footwork will be penalized. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. An Axel is considered a single jump. Required individual jumps cannot be repeated as part of the combination jump, (i.e. the flip jump cannot be repeated in the combination for Preliminary.)

Jumps:

There is no music for this event. Jumps should be skated exactly as stated and in this order. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. This is not a "Mini Program". Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jump will be allowed. Extra moves such as spirals, pivots, etc. will be penalized. Jumps will be offered at the Pre-Preliminary thru Juvenile levels only. Entrants qualify according to their Free Skate level entered or if no Free Skate is entered, by Test level. **This event will be conducted as follows:** At the conclusion of the warm up period, the first skater will present the first jump twice, then the second jump twice. The judges will score the best performance for each jump. The process will then be repeated for the remaining number of skaters. An Axel is considered a single jump. In situations where the skater is given a choice of jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jumps to be judged and the skater will not be allowed to change jumps on the second attempt.

*Juvenile & Intermediate Jumps - Two skaters, one from each group will enter the ice from their designated end of the rink. Each of those skaters will be allowed full use of the ice to complete their jumps, while of course, avoiding each other.

Dance:

The following dance events will be offered. No age restrictions in the regular events. Participants in the Adult Dance events must be 21 years of age or older as of July 25, 2010. Skaters may compete at their test level and/or one level higher. Due to time constraints, some lower dance groups may be flighted.

Open Solo Dance:

Open to any skater. No test or age restrictions. Each dance is a separate event. Competition dances - Cha Cha, Ten Fox.

Open Adult Solo Dance:

Open to any adult skater. Each event is a separate event. Competition dances - Fiesta Tango, Willow Waltz.

Free Dance and Original Dance Couples:

Free dance will be offered for Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior Levels in accordance with rules set in US Figure Skating Rule Book 2010-11 season.

Original Dance will be offered for Junior and Senior in accordance with US Figure Skating Rule Book for the 2010-11 Competitive Season.

Pairs:

Pair competition will consist of a freestyle program for Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, and Intermediate. It will consist of both short and long programs as separate events for Novice through Senior. Test level is as of 7/25/10. **The ISU Judging System will be used for all Juvenile through Senior Pair Short Program and Freeskate Events.**

Deductions **WILL** be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.
