

Summary of CSC Awards presented each year at our annual banquet:

CSC Awards (updated 12/2/06):

Outstanding Achievement: (Trophy)

Awarded to the top point winner in the Club for skating year: Jan ñ Dec calendar year. (qualifying and non qualifying competitions and tests passed) This is an individual award ñ not team. This excludes Synchronized Skating. Pair Team and Dance Team skaters enter individually.

Points are counted as follows:

Tests: All points counted

Non-Qualifying Competitions: All points are counted

Southwestern Regionals: Initial round and final round freeski are counted

Midwestern Sectionals, USFS Nationals, International Competitions: All points are counted

Beginning with award presented Jan 2006 the Outstanding Achievement will be separated into **TWO** awards:

Scott Hamilton Outstanding Achievement Award: Novice Level Skaters and above

Scott Hamilton Outstanding Achievement Award: Intermediate Level Skaters and below

Outstanding Achievement - In the event of a tie then two awards will awarded.

Skaters can win each of the levels only once. Beginning Jan 2006 the last skater who won presents to the newly awarded skater. For presentation 2006 (the award winner of 2005 present to both winners: Juvenile & below and Intermediate and above). In the event that the last year's previous winner is not present, we will ask the winner from the year before, etc.

Beginning 2006, at the awards banquet each year, we will recognize all past winners of the Outstanding Achievement Award who are present.

DeLio Award ñ chosen by the coaches ñ enthusiasm (trophy) This award is given to a skater who displays tremendous work ethic and good attitude in all aspects of skating. The following are considerations for this award: how well does the skater use practice time, what is the skater's attitude toward coaches and other skaters when on practice ice, at the arena, does the skater know how to both win and lose graciously, and how does the skater handle him/herself at competitions.

Coaches receive a nomination form from Awards Committee in December. Ballots with 5 nominations are due back to Awards Committee 3 weeks after receipt. Awards Committee tallies the votes creates a final ballot with the top 5 nominees. Coaches who participated in the initial ballot receive final ballots. Ballots are put in a blank envelope. The blank envelope is put in another envelope with coach's name in the upper corner. Anonymous votes cannot be counted.

Doug Goss Award ñ Volunteer Award (determined by CSC board) (plaque)

Douglas K Goss Outstanding Volunteer Award in honor of one of CSC finest volunteer. The purpose: to recognize individuals who have gone over and above the call of duty and given of their time and talents for the benefit of Colorado Skating Club. It is recommended that the nominated volunteer be a member of CSC for 5 years or more.

President calls for nominations from the Board of Directors. A ballot slate is determined from nominations. Votes are gathered either in person or via e-mail. President appoints one member to review and tally votes.

Achievement Award in each Level, (i.e. Preliminary Ladies, Juvenile Pairs, etc) (top point winner of each) (Trophy) Total of each level point sheets determines winner for each level. All competition points are counted.

National/Sectional Awards ñ awarded to Sectional, National and Jr National competitorsí trophy (the award is recognized at the highest level ñ i.e. if skater does make Sectionals but not Nationals then they receive the trophy for Sectionals). This does include skaters who did compete in Nationals as part of a Synchro team. (trophy) - Qualifying competition results.

Certificates ñ each skater who completes the awards form receives a certificate - congratulation for an outstanding year of skating. Determined by Tests, Qualifying and Nonqualifying from points sheets.

Synchro Team Recognition Award - Synchro team coaches recognize one skater from each team for the quality they wish to award ñ i.e. leadership, team work, most improvement, etc. (Trophy)

Note ñ All trophies are given to skater to keep they are not traveling trophies.

For all Awards connected to Award Points:

Forms will be available by November 1 each year, weíd like them posted on the website, as well as having them posted on the club bulletin board. **A mailing will go out between approximately one month prior to the banquet date for attendance** and a reminder to turn in their completed forms by stated deadline. Information will be included in the Newsletter, in the event we no longer have a newsletter forms will need to be mailed out to members.

Awards Point sheets will be sent to the Board of Directors, Post Office Box. **The Banquet Committee and two board members will review, tabulate and calculate** all points by given deadline which is at least two weeks prior to the event. Cutoff date for submission will be stated on the form and will be at least 3 weeks prior to event. (Late forms will not be accepted
